
Now it's up to you


Are happiness and joy the same thing?

4 Are happiness and joy the same thing?


Happiness and joy are **not** synonymous. It is possible to *feel* very happy and yet *be* very sad, empty and lonely. Happiness is a temporary sensation; joy is a state of mind. Happiness can be prompted by parties, music and colors; joy is the result of real relationships, right decisions and correct actions. That's why carnival can generate happiness but will never lead you to joy.




To be happy is to feel the emotion of the moment. To be joyful is to know your life has a purpose and a destiny. It's to being in peace with yourself and your Creator.

The road to joy

God loves you! And more than anyone He is interested in a true and permanent joyful life for you. Jesus explained that "the thief (the devil) comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I (Jesus) have come that they may have life, and have it to the full" (John 10:10). This life to the full is also called eternal life in the Bible: "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16). So: <u>Jesus is the Way to</u> the real joyous life. He Himself said: "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except







- · You are a sinner and, therefore, are separated from God. "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 6:23).
- Only Jesus can pay the penalty for your sins: "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith-- and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God -- not by works, so that no one can boast" (Ephesians 2:8.9).
- All you have to do is repent, believe and accept Jesus as your personal Saviour: "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9).
